Genesis 3:1-2

- 1 Now the serpent was more cunning than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said to the woman, "Has God indeed said, 'You shall not eat of every tree of the garden'?"
- 2 And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat the fruit of the trees of the garden;

Genesis 3:3-5

- 3 but of the fruit of the tree which *is* in the midst of the garden, God has said, 'You shall not eat it, nor shall you touch it, lest you die.'"
- 4 Then the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die.

Truth Defined (Webster's)

- fidelity, constancy b: sincerity in action, character, and utterance
- 1a the state of being the case: fact (2): the body of real things, events, and facts: actuality spiritual reality
- 1b: a judgment, proposition, or idea that is true or accepted as true < truths of thermodynamics > c: the body of true statements and propositions
- 2a: the property (as of a statement) of being in accord with fact or reality
- 2 b: fidelity to an original or to a standard

Substantive theories

Correspondence theories state that true beliefs and true statements correspond to the actual state of affairs. This type of theory posits a relationship between thoughts or statements on the one hand, and things or objects on the other. It is a traditional model which goes back at least to some of the classical Greek philosophers such as Socrates, Plato, and Aristotle. This class of theories holds that the truth or the falsity of a representation is determined in principle solely by how it relates to "things", by whether it accurately describes those "things".

Relativism

Relativism is the concept that points of view have no absolute truth or validity, having only relative, subjective value according to differences in perception and consideration. The term is often used to refer to the context of moral principle, where in a relativistic mode of thought, principles and ethics are regarded as applicable in only limited context. There are many forms of relativism which vary in their degree of controversy

Creation, The Fall, Redemption

- Creation: It was perfect
- The Fall: Causing all to change and take on fallen characteristics that groan to be put back to perfection.
- Redemption: The putting back of the fallen world to it's original splendor and purpose.

Romans 8:22-23

22 For we know that the whole creation groans and labors with birth pangs together until now. 23 Not only *that*, but we also who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, eagerly waiting for the adoption, the redemption of our body.

Sin (Webster's) (Which one is Relative?)

1a: an offense against religious or moral law

b: an action that is or is felt to be highly reprehensible

2a: transgression of the law of God

FAQ1: What is Sin and Who Created it?

- SIN IS LAWLESSNESS (1 John 3:4)
 Everyone who practices sin also practices lawlessness; and sin is lawlessness.
- SIN IS UNRIGHTEOUSNESS (1 John 5:17)
 All unrighteousness is sin
- Sin / Evil is the natural outcome of rebellion against God, A result of giving man choice.

God is Only Righteous

- Deuteronomy 32:4 He is the Rock, His work is perfect; For all His ways are justice, A God of truth and without injustice; Righteous and upright is He.
- Psalm 92:15 To declare that the LORD is upright; He is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in Him.
